Heacham has markedly older population than that of the district and the country. In 2001 35% of the population was over 65 compared with 21% for Borough Council King's Lynn and West Norfolk (BCKLWN) and 16% for England. This emphasis has widened quite rapidly since then with an estimated over 42% over 65 in 2017 in Heacham compared to 26% in BCKLWN. 2017 figures are not available for England. There has been a slight fall in the population from 4,750 in 2011, to an estimated 4,649 for 2017. This may be attributable to an increase in the number of second homes or a fall in average household size associated with the ageing population. The decrease is small however and may not be significant given the margin of error in the 2017 estimates.

The Office for National Statistics Report 'Living Longer: how our population is changing and why it matters', published in August 2018 reports that in 50 years' time, there are likely to be an additional 8.6 million people aged 65 years and over in the UK – a population roughly the size of London. The percentage of people aged 65+ in BCKLWN is estimated to rise by nearly 7% to 32.27% by 2039.

As can be seen in the table above, 48% of the homes in Heacham have no permanent residents compared to 14.9% in King's Lynn and west Norfolk and just 4.3% in England.

This figure includes houses temporarily vacant, second homes and holiday lets and suggests a high level of second homes and holiday lets in Heacham. Being a coastal resort Heacham has a high proportion of caravans at 39.4%, significantly higher than BCKLWN and England as a whole.

Otherwise the housing stock reflects the rural character of the area with a relatively high proportion of detached and semi-detached properties and correspondingly less terraced houses and apartments.

Heacham has a significantly higher proportion of households occupied by single people age 65 and over than either BCKLWN or England as a whole.

The other household types category covers several sub-sets and consist of households occupied by more than one family or unrelated individuals. The proportion of households in this group is much lower than in England and BCBCKLWN. Typically these households are more numerous in urban areas where students and young professionals may share a household.

The pattern of economic activity in Heacham mainly reflects the age structure. The proportion of people working from home in Heacham is substantially lower than nationally or BCKLWN. For those travelling to work the proportion going by car either as driver or passenger is much higher than nationally and slightly higher than for BCKLWN. Similarly the proportion using motor cycle or moped is higher than KLBC or nationally. The proportions using public transport higher than for England and broadly in line with BCKLWN. A higher proportion of Heacham residents travel to work on foot than that of BCKLWN, but the figure is broadly in line with those for England as a whole.
